Finance Committee Reflections: Sounds From the Bean Counters

and wet weather we have been experiencing.

February contributions were \$18,000, which exceeds the budget by \$230 and last year by \$537. Our apportionment giving (Mission Giving) budgeted and \$1,817 higher than February 2014.

Operating expenses in February were \$312 less than budgeted and \$633 lower than February Our operating cash balance at the end of February 2014. Trustee spending was favorable which offset was a negative \$4,329 compared to a negative higher Council on Ministries, Mission Giving and \$1,670 at the end of January. Administrative expenses. Year-to-date operating expenses are \$4,766 less than budgeted and We thank each and every one of you for your \$7,785 less than last year. Versus the budget, financial support. We need to continue to have Mission Giving and Trustee expenses are the most favorable contributions and expenses as well and favorable, and the same holds true compared to hope for sources to generate other income. We last year.

For the month, we had a cash outflow of \$2,400 resulting in a year-to-date cash outflow of \$3,500.

It appears that maybe winter is finally over. Seeing While our contributions were up slightly and the sun is certainly an improvement of the cold expenses lower, we did not receive enough other income to allow us to achieve the budgeted cash outflow.

Year-to-date contributions are \$941 higher than through February was \$4,324, which is \$2,094 less than budgeted. In February, we sent \$3,300 to the Conference.

I'm excited for the new opportunities that we have available to us to worship the Lord during this season!

ORAL HEALTH

Oral health is a window to your overall health. Problems in your mouth can affect the rest of your body. Good oral health improves a person's ability to speak, smile, smell, taste, touch, chew, swallow, and make facial expressions to show feelings and emotions. Poor oral health can lead to tooth decay, gum disease, and/or oral cancer. Saliva washes away food and neutralizes acids produced by bacteria in the mouth, helping to protect you from an overgrowth of bacteria that might lead to gum disease. Some medications can decrease the flow of saliva, such as diuretics, decongestants, and antihistamines, and therefore, may cause gum disease and eventually loss of teeth.

Steps to prevent tooth decay and loss:

- † Brush your teeth at least twice a day
- † Floss daily
- † Eat a healthy diet
- † Replace your toothbrush every three to four months or sooner if bristles are frayed
- † Schedule regular dental checkups
- † Contact your dentist as soon as an oral health problem arise
- † Don't smoke smokers have seven times the risk of developing periodontal disease compared to non-smokers

PET to Benefit from St. Mark's April 18 BBQ




This is not a child's toy. This is not a carnival ride. This is a serious piece of equipment. In fact, this is a wheelchair. It doesn't look like the traditional hospital wheelchair because it is made for use in developing countries without paved roads or sidewalks by people with mobility limitations. It is called a PET, for Personal Energy Transportation, and San Antonio is one of 22 building sites in the U.S. We at PET San Antonio plan to build 120 of these wheelchairs this year, which will cost \$350 each to build and ship. Thus far this year, we have shipped PETs to Mexico, and we plan to ship 50 units to Nigeria in the next couple of weeks.



Dear St. Mark's Congregation,

Thanks to your commitment to reaching out past the walls of the church to bring Christ to others, your continued support of our Food Pantry has helped meet the needs of many in our neighborhood. And it just seems that the more people we help, the greater the opportunity becomes to serve even more.

In the past, we have had a Food Drive twice a year where you have brought canned and boxed food to place on the altar. Recently we have added a "Noisy Offering" for those who prefer to make a cash donation. We place your food donations in the Pantry and shop with your cash donations to purchase additional food. Bags of groceries are made up, usually enough to feed a family of four for a couple of days to sustain them until they can make other arrangements to take care of their family. We also make up "Snack Bags" for people in transition who stop by the church and are hungry at that time. Many don't have homes and we have heard some take donated food and go to the corner store to heat it in the microwave.

The need continues to grow and we are coming to you to ask for your additional help. In September, we fed 33 people/families with "Snack Bags" and "Grocery Bags." In November, that number rose to 42. And in February, we fed 68 individuals and families!

With your help, we will continue to meet the need rather than have to turn people away. We are going to start buying food from the San Antonio Food Bank so your cash donations go farther. And, this is where you come in: We are going to designate each Sunday in the month with a specific food item for you to bring to church. We will put reminders in the Church Bulletin, but we would like to ask that you please bring **one food item per person** to church, as follows:

1st Sunday of the month: A can of Vegetables 2nd Sunday of the month: A 1-pound bag of Rice or Beans (or both) 3rd Sunday of the month: A can of Meat (Chicken, Tuna, Spam) 4th Sunday of the month: A can of Spaghetti Sauce

5th Sunday of the month: Surprise Us!

In addition, we will designate the last Sunday of each month as a "Noisy Offering" day if you would like to support the Food Pantry with your loose change with which we can buy food items in need.
