Ruth spent their time on earth and now are again joined together in the heavenly portals for all eternity.



According to the <u>National Stroke Association</u>, a person experiencing a stroke can be treated if people have acted FAST - 80% of strokes can also be prevented.

FAST being an acronym for things to check in a suspected stroke victim:

- F Face: Does the face droop on one side when the person smiles?
- A Arm: After raising both arms, does one of the arms drift downwards?
- **S Speech:** After repeating a simple phrase, does the persons speech sound slurred or strange?
- T Time: If any or all of the above are observed call for 9-1-1 and ask for medical assistance

OTHER SYMPTOMS TO LOOK FOR – Sudden numbness or weakness of the leg; sudden confusion or trouble understanding; sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes; sudden trouble walking, dizziness or loss of balance or coordination; sudden severe headache with no known cause.



GET READY - THE PUMPKINS ARE COMING AGAIN!

It is almost time for the Pumpkin Patch. The pumpkins are scheduled to arrive at 8:30 a.m., Saturday, October 4th. The Patch will open that afternoon. In order to keep the Patch open the 3½ weeks, we will need to have 84 different shifts (2 persons per shift). As you can imagine, we really need everyone to volunteer if possible. To staff the Patch will require that many volunteers work multiple shifts. There are many areas in which we need volunteers and we hope that you feel able to volunteer for one or more of the jobs. The following are ways that you can help:


- <u>Picking Up & Unloading Hay</u> (We will be picking up 100 bales of hay on Saturday, September 27^{th.})
- <u>Setting up Canopy</u> (This will be done following the unloading of the hay.)
- <u>Unloading Pumpkins</u> (Assistance needed to unload pumpkins on October 4th. Also, bring your wheelbarrow if possible.)
- <u>Feeding the Workers</u> (We always feed the workers the day we unload pumpkins. Need help with preparation and serving.)
- <u>Removal of Rotting Pumpkins</u> (Volunteers are needed to remove rotting pumpkins. They must be out before the children come for story time.)
- Readers for Story Time (Beginning Monday, October 13, we will be having story time for the visiting students at (9:00, 10:00 and 10:30 a.m. We need two people to read to each group each day and someone to pass out gift bags to the students and sell pumpkins to the parents that chaperone.
- <u>Stuffing Bags for Story Time</u> (This is will be done the week of October 6th. We expect more than 400 children to visit the Patch for Story Time.)
- <u>Wash Pumpkins</u> (Pumpkins for story time have to be washed the week of October 6th. We will need more than 400 pumpkins.)
- <u>Prayer Request Chairman</u> (We need someone to see that prayer requests turned in a the Patch are gotten to the prayer warriors. The Chairman can develop their own system for distributing the requests. It can be done by phone, email, regular mail or personal delivery.)
- <u>Candy Donations</u> (Much candy is required because we give a gift bag to each child that visits the Patch. We will begin collecting candy on September 1st. Please be generous with your candy donations and **NO CHOCOLATES!!**)
- <u>Finance Committee</u> (The finance committee could use assistance in counting the money each morning. A financial report must be made daily to Pumpkin Patch USA.)
- <u>Prayers</u> (Most important of all! We need your prayers that workers will be plentiful and the Patch will be successful.

For those of you who just think you cannot work in the Patch, you do not have to worry about lifting pumpkins. Customers are almost always glad to do the lifting or you can just ask another visitor in the Patch for help. Also, wagons are available. It is a great way to reach out to the community and a good way to get to know fellow church members. (If you have friend that would work with you, sign them up!) So – no excuses – WE NEED YOUR HELP!

If you would be interested in joining us for any or all of this study, we would love to have you. The planned schedule for August is:


