

APPORTIONMENTS WE ARE CALLED. . .

... to be stewards of hope.



The community of God's stewards trusts that our lives and all of human history both originate in God and will be consummated in God. Thus, all of time itself is a gift given into our care as stewards. The community of stewards can never live in the present moment as an end in itself, whether in the despair of crisis or in the careless pursuit of self-gratification.

The biblical understanding of Sabbath observance stands as a reminder of the gift of our days, which God has given into our care. Because we know a past with God (memory) and trust that the future is also God's (vision), the community of stewards can live ever present as filled with the possibilities of hope. Our time cannot then be squandered in despair or self-satisfaction but must be used in the service of God's hopeful purposes and our partnership with those purposes as the community of stewards.

Implications

These thought on the theological foundations of our work are but a brief sampling of the rich biblical and historical traditions on the role of steward. This is an understanding and a focus, which need to be recovered and reclaimed for the wider witness and services of the church in the world of our time.

They reflect a sense that all our resources come from God and should be received and managed by the church as God's representatives. Enabling the church's mission for the sake of God's kingdom must take priority over institutional, regional or local self-interest, and we have sought to embody this missional priority in our recommendations.

They reflect a call to establish stewardship as a central element in our self-identity as the people of God. To enter covenant relationship with God is to become informed and equipped to understand and exercise the role of steward, both in the life of the church and in the life of the world.

The church must consciously commit itself to education and reflection on the role of the steward as an ongoing priority of Christian discipleship. They reflect a concern for justice and equity as a central commitment for the covenant community of God's stewards. Any formulas or systems for collecting and distributing funds must seek justice and equity in light of diverse economic circumstances throughout the church.

Maria's Basket

¡Hola! to all of you who read our Messenger every month. I am Maria R. Soto, the new pastor here at St. Mark's UMC and I would like you to know a little bit about me. Allow me to start with a brief introduction about my place of birth. I was born on the small island of Puerto Rico. You may wonder, "where is that?" If you look in Wikipedia, you'll find

something like this: Puerto Rico, officially the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico is an incorporated territory of the United States located in the northeast Caribbean Sea. It is an archipelago that includes the main island of Puerto Rico and a number of smaller ones, such as Mona, Culebra and Viques. Puerto Ricans are, by law, natural-born citizens of the United States and may move freely between the island and the mainland. The capital is San Juan. It's official languages are Spanish and English, though Spanish predominates.

I am the youngest of 5 children in my family. My parents live in Puerto Rico and I try to see them every year. Every Sunday morning, my grandparents were engaged in taking all of their grandchildren to the church worship with the promise of eating ice cream or a bag of chips of our choice after service, and that was enough to get our attention. So I grew up knowing in my heart that God is real and that I needed a relationship with Him. Mother made us go to church 'til she couldn't any more. But one day, I said: "I am going to church tonight to see what God has for me." I was 14 years old. When I got to church and they started singing, I felt something in me and realized I was a sinner and I needed to give my life to Christ. I was crying through the service until the pastor made the call to discipleship. That day I was born again. Since then, I have been active in the life of the church in everything I was asked to do. Years later, I met Reynaldo Rodriguez. We got married and in 1998 came to live in the U.S. e lived in North Carolina, Rochester, NY and in 2003 came to the Rio Grande Valley in Texas.

Around 2004, we started going to "El Buen Pastor" UMC in Edinburg, Texas for two years. Then we met the Espericueta family at that church and they introduced us to a lay leader in charge of "Cristo El Vencedor" in Faysville, TX, north of Edinburg. There we helped with Sunday School classes, in charge of the youth program, preaching, VBS, and everything we could. Until the lay leader became a local pastor and that is when the need of a lay leader to be in charge of that little church opened the opportunity for me. They asked me if I would like to take care of them and I accepted the challenge. And since 2010, I have been going to Perkins School of Theology in Dallas. Since then, I became a local pastor. That is how I came to ministry. I knew I had the call from God, but I avoided answering until I could no longer. Seven years has passed and I served in the Rio Grande Conference until it merged with the Southwest Texas Conference becoming the Rio Texas Conference. I have always worked with Hispanic congregations until this year (2017) when the Lord called me for an even greater challenge, to be the pastor of this beautiful congregation - St. Mark's UMC. I am overwhelmed by God for he does marvelous things with us that we could never imagine. I am grateful to God and to St. Mark's UMC for welcoming my husband and me. I am excited to get to know the members and this community around us. May we be a blessing for all of you and this community as well.

Comments:

June contributions were \$749 higher than budgeted and \$246 higher than June 2016. Other income was \$3,308 higher than budgeted and \$2,698 higher than 2016.

Operating expenses were \$351 favorable to the budget and \$2,330 unfavorable to 2016. Expenses were favorable primarily due to lower Trustee Expenses (lower Electricity and repairs and maintenance), Lay Personnel compensation, being offset by Pastor Compensation (Pastor Maria Housing) and Mission Giving.

June had a cash outflow of \$4,060. Our operating cash balance decreased to a negative \$7,572.

The Finance Committee thanks your continued support during 2017. Please keep the Finance Committee in your prayers as decisions impacting the finances of the church are made.
