Finance Committee Reflections: Sounds From the Bean Counters

Wow! The weather in San Antonio has become so beautiful, cooler days and occasional rain. Let's hope it continues!

Contributions in October exceeded last year by nearly \$3,000 while trailing the budget by just under \$2,000. Year-to-date, our contributions are #3,750 higher than 2012 while \$4,500 less than budgeted.

The October operating expenses are \$8,400 lower than last October. With the exception of Lay Personnel Compensation, all expense areas are lower, the most significant being Mission Giving and Trustee expenses. Compared to budget, all areas are lower, resulting in our expenses being \$5,900 favorable. Year-to-date operating expenses are \$2,600 higher than last year while \$19,000 lower than budgeted.


In October we had a cash outflow of \$437. Our year-to-date cash outflow is \$13,600.

Through October, our apportionment payments trail the budget by \$2,299. In order to meet our annual commitment, we have to pay an additional \$9,689 by year-end.

At the end of October our operating cash balance was \$1,920.

As the year-end approaches, we are hopeful we will get your continued financial support so we can achieve our apportionment goal and end the year with a strong operating cash balance. If history is any indication, this should not be a problem, as you are always there when needed.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENTS & OTHER CLERGY SUPPORT

In our local churches approximately 1/2 of local expenses go to paying for the salary and benefits of the pastors and lay employees of the church.

Salaries are not overhead to the church; they are the way we do ministry.

Local church salaries are made much more effective by the money given to this apportioned fund. The Bishop and Cabinet work closely with our churches to be sure that they have the best clergy leadership possible and intervene when necessary to solve problems that would otherwise become destructive.

Whenever the need is greatest in the local church, the district superintendent and Bishop are there to provide guidance and leadership when a pastor may become disabled and unable to provide leadership. The church is hurting for their pastor. The district superintendent and Bishop arrange for the pastor to access disability benefits and provide temporary pastoral leadership in the short term. Healing is begun.

Another church needs to change its direction of ministry. It's leading laity are just beginning to recognize the need. They're concerned that the current pastor's strengths are not the strengths they need to move in the direction they foresee. The district superintendent and the Bishop step in to help them to clarify their goals and work with them to secure the leadership they need.

Another church is growing so fast, the pastor and his laity are beginning to be unable to deal with all the change they are encountering. The district superintendent steps in here also to help them locate the tools they need to handle the changing needs of the church. The seven districts of the Southwest Texas conference are diverse, geographically, sometimes covering many, many miles. District superintendents travel to that area relentlessly providing leadership and guidance for building an effective church.

Each year an average of one-third of pastors move from one church to another. The cost of moving is provided through the moving fund supported by this apportionment. Some churches become temporarily unable to pay their pastor. They need assistance for 2 to 3 years in order to move back to a position where they are still supporting. The equitable compensation funds supplied through this apportionment subsidize ministry in their church while they are moving back to a position of self-sufficiency.

Ministry is people. This apportionment provides for their most effective use in the church.


St. Mark's UMC - In Mission ...





Wholey Moley! Discovering Super Whole Grains

Whole grains, like oatmeal, whole-grain breads, and brown rice can reduce the risk of heart disease.

Every organ in the body depends on strong blood flow. If you take care of your heart and make sure it is strong and healthy, there is a good chance that you are getting the right amount of blood to your organs, which includes the brain. Whole grains are high in fiber, which is important for digestive health. Whole grains have other nutrients that work together in powerful ways.

Whole Wheat Pancakes with Blueberries (Adapted from 101 Cookbooks)

Ingredients for 6 large pancakes or 12 small pancakes Serving size = 1 large or 2 small pancakes.

1 cup whole wheat flour 1/2 tsp baking powder

1/4 tsp baking soda

1/4 cup sugar

1/4 tsp salt

1 cup + 2 Tbsp buttermilk

1 egg, lightly beaten

1 Tbsp oil

1 cup blueberries

1/4 cup walnuts, chopped (optional)

- 1. Combine the flour, baking powder, baking soda, sugar and salt
- 2. Add in buttermilk, eggs and oil
- 3. Fold in blueberries
- 4. Heat a griddle and spray with oil. Drop a small amount of batter (about 1/4 cup for 1 large, or 2 Tbsp for 1 small) and cook until bubbles start forming. Flip and cook thoroughly.
- 5. Serve with agave or maple syrup.


