

What a blessing it was to have Marine Corporal Bobby Barrera (medically retired) with us in church on Veterans Day! Rob Remig began the sermon by recounting how he had met Bobby on the Burn Unit at Brooke Army Medical Center in 1969, where Rob was an occupational therapist and Bobby was a patient receiving care for his burns and other severe injuries. As Rob outlined, Bobby did not let his injuries dictate what kind of a life he would lead after he left the military, as he has gone on to lead a full and remarkable life. After earning two college degrees, Bobby taught school for five years, was a juvenile probation counselor for another five years, and then served as the Director of the Family Support Center at Laughlin Air Force Base for 15 years. Among his many awards and accomplishments, Bobby received the Purple Heart Medal, was named the Texas and National Disabled Veteran of the Year, and was elected the National Commander for the 1.2 million-member Disabled American Veterans. Bobby's most recent honor is having his quote selected and etched on a glass wall at the Disabled Veterans for Life Memorial in Washington, DC, dedicated on October 4, 2014. His quote: "I have a purpose in life, and that's been to help other military families through some of what I had to go through. If I had to go through it myself in order to help others, I'm okay with that." Rob and Bobby were reunited at the May 26, 2014 Memorial Day service in Del Rio, TX, 45 years after their first meeting. Finance Committee Reflections: Sounds From the Bean Counters



It is sad to see the pumpkins leave us, but we are so thankful for the successful 2014 Pumpkin Patch. Many people contributed their time to this event. Congratulations to each of you. Also, how about the rain? What a blessing that was.

Contributions in October were nearly \$22,300, \$3,600 more than last October and \$2,200 higher than budgeted. Year-to-date contributions are \$191,600, which are \$8,500 less than last year and \$8,700 lower than budgeted. While our contributions are still trailing year-to-date, we thank you for your stronger October contributions. We hope this will continue.

Our operating expenses were \$32,100 in October, \$12,700 higher than last October and \$4,300 higher than budgeted. Compared to last year, the variance relates to higher Mission Giving expense coupled with higher Pastor Compensation and Lay Personnel Compensation. Compensation was higher due to five payrolls for weekly employees and three payrolls for the bi-weekly employees.

Year-to-date operating expenses are \$5,263 higher than last year but \$8,700 favorable to the budget. The vari-

ance to last year is primarily the result of the different number of payrolls in October 2014 compared to October 2013. The favorable spending versus the budget is the result of lower Trustee spending partially offset by higher Mission Giving.

At the end of October, our operating cash balance is a negative \$11,622. This is \$1,852 more negative than September. While we had a cash outflow of \$9,200 in October, we transferred \$8,000 from our TMF operating fund which helped reduce the impact on our operating cash balance. As was mentioned last month, we truly need your help so we can get our operating cash balance in a positive position before we enter 2015.

At the end of October, our apportionment spending is \$3,800 ahead of the budget.

We continue to be grateful to everyone's contribution of time, talent and treasure. Without the help of all of you who contribute so much time to St. Mark's our cash position would be even more negative. We just ask that as we enter the holiday season you keep St. Mark's on your mind. God bless you all.

Stewardship - Ministerial Support

The goal of ministerial support is to supply effective spiritual and administrative leadership to local churches and the world. 12.5 cents of every apportioned dollar is allocated to District Superintendents and Other Clergy Support.

District Superintendent - Chief Mission Strategist

In our local churches, approximately half of our local giving pays for salaries and benefits of the pastors and lay employees of the church. Salaries are not overhead to the church, but certainly are the way we do ministry.

Local church salaries are made much more effective by the money given to this apportioned item. The Bishop and Cabinet work closely with churches to ensure they have the best clergy leadership possible, and to intervene when necessary to solve problems that would otherwise become destructive.

Whenever a need arises in the local church, the District Superintendent and Bishop provide guidance and leadership. For example, if a pastor becomes disabled or is unable to provide leadership, or if the church is hurting for their pastor, the Dis-

trict Superintendent and Bishop arrange for the pastor to access disability benefits and provide temporary pastoral leadership in the short-term. Thus, healing begins.


The seven districts of the Southwest Texas Conference are diverse geographically, sometimes blanketing many miles. District Superintendents travel their areas relentlessly, providing leadership and guidance to build effective and vital churches.

Moving Expenses

Each year an average of 1/3 of our pastors move from one church to another, and the cost of moving is provided through the moving fund supported by this apportionment.

Some churches become temporarily unable to pay their pastor and may need assistance for 2-3 years before becoming self-supporting again. The equitable compensation funds supplied through this apportionment subsidizes the ministry in their church while it's moving toward self-sufficiency.

Ministry is people. This apportionment provides for the most effective use of the people who provide clergy leadership.



Jesus said: "I am the vine and you are the branches; if you remain in me and I in you, much fruit will be produced." Clearly, St. Mark's UMC is abiding in Christ, because this year has borne witness to the production of much fruit. New ministries, new people, new ways of experiencing worship and witness are evidence that our branch is connected to the True Vine.

We celebrate the maturing and seasoning of some ministries that were begun in the last few years; our Food Truck ministry is better equipped, more organized, more client friendly and is bearing much fruit in serving the needs of the poor and hungry. Our Food Pantry, likewise, is better equipped and better organized ensuring that whoever comes to St Mark's will be fed on any given day and time, with other assistance offered regularly at other scheduled times and opportunities. We've begun our third year into our Wednesday night praise and worship service and it continues to grow in size, in diversity and in outreach. We've added a meal that brings us together at 6:30 and this weekly fellowship has blossomed into a sweet, special time of worship that we all look forward to each week. This year's Pumpkin Patch proved once again to be a model of Evangelism as well as a Mission event, making this year's total of selling over \$17,000 in pumpkins a new record. Our ESL classes have begun their second year with much joy and success, offering a professional and meaningful experience of learning English, making stronger and more productive citizens of those who want to communicate more effectively. Out of this ministry, a new one developed thanks to the generous offer of Rev. Guillermo Chavez, the leader of the ESL classes; he leads a Conversational Spanish Class on Monday evenings, allowing the participants to learn how to be more effective in our ability to speak the words of Christ to our neighbors. This class will be performing "Sois La Semilla" in Spanish at the main worship service on November 30th!

We've had to say goodbye to 14 devoted members this past year; 11 to death, and three to other churches. We know that God continues to lead them and us in the ways of discipleship and mature faith, and we are confident that the Holy Spirit will lead others to the mission and ministries of St. Mark's. As we've said goodbye, we've also said hello! We've had seven professions of faith and many numerous and various visitors who are connecting with our church. Just as the branches of a vine are pruned from time to time to enhance growth, we know that as long as we are connected to the Source of Life, the True Vine, we will be producing fruit that is pleasing to God. Let us go forward into our future in faith, confident in the Power and Presence of God with us all ways. God bless you and I'll see you in church!

World AIDS Day

In recognition of World AIDS Day on December 1, your Wesley Nurse encourages everyone in San Antonio, TX to get tested for HIV, the virus that causes AIDS. In the United States, about 1 in 5 people who has HIV doesn’t know it.

The only way to know for sure whether or not you have HIV is to get tested. You could have HIV and still feel healthy. Everyone ages 15 to 65 needs to get tested at least once. Some people may need to get tested more often.

HIV is passed from one person to another by:

- † Having unprotected sex with a person who has HIV
- † Sharing needles with someone who has HIV
- † Breastfeeding, pregnancy, or childbirth if the mother has HIV
- † Getting a transfusion of blood that’s infected with HIV (very rare in the United States)

Around the world, about 34 million people are living with HIV. In the United States, about 50,000 people get infected with HIV every year. World AIDS Day is a global initiative to raise awareness, fight prejudice, and improve education about HIV and AIDS.

Thanks to the many volunteers who helped at the October Food Truck Delivery. We fed 200 people!


