Healthy Tips - Just in time for Thanksgiving Day!

Start the day off with a good breakfast so you won't be tempted to overeat.

Nibble on raw vegetables with low-fat dips before dinner rather than salted nuts or cheese and crackers.

Have a small plate of the foods you like best and then move away from the buffet table.

Eat slowly. It takes at least 20 minutes for your brain to realize you're full.

Choose white rather than dark turkey meat, without the skin.

Make mashed potatoes with low-fat milk and margarine instead of butter, and take it easy with the gravy. Skim the fat off the top of the gravy before serving.

Steam vegetables like peas and green beans rather serving them in a casserole with creamed sauces.

Bake stuffing in a casserole dish rather than inside a turkey so you can make it with less fat. Bake with low-fat broth and margarine.

Make cranberry sauce with fresh cranberries. Canned cranberry sauce is high in sugar.

If you're going to drink a glass or two of wine, do it with dinner, rather than starting earlier. Consider diluting white wine with seltzer water to make a wine spritzer.

Have dessert with everyone else, but choose pumpkin pie over pecan pie, or bring dessert you've made with an artificial sweetener. Top it with low-fat whipped cream.

Comments:

October contributions were \$2,828 less than budgeted and \$5,665 less than October 2016. Other income was \$1,685 higher than budgeted and \$2,658 higher than 2016.

Operating expenses were \$2,858 less than budgeted and \$1,353 higher than 2016. Versus the budget Operating expenses were favorable primarily due payroll expense being lower due to Pastor Soto versus Pastor Brown coupled with lower Secretary and Maintenance payroll. Versus 2016, operating expenses are higher as a result of higher Mission Giving, partially offset by lower payroll.

October had a cash outflow of \$1,325. Our operating cash balance decreased to a positive \$483.

We were able to maintain a positive operating cash balance as the result of October having five Sundays.

The Finance Committee asks you to review your level of support to St. Mark's, especially as we approach Commitment Sunday. Your support is necessary to sustain the church. Please keep St. Mark's in your prayers.
