The year continues to move pretty quickly! It's already time for the season of Lent! Ash Wednesday services will be held on Wednesday, February 13th. We will observe a full service at noon, which will include the imposition

of ashes. Also, we will incorporate the imposition of ashes at our Contemporary Praise service at 7 pm. You can come to one or the other...or both!

Ash Wednesday has been a very meaningful day as a prelude to the Lenten season. Growing up, I knew little about the season of Lent, and my home church didn't observe it. It wasn't until I was at seminary in 1979 that I became familiar with the themes and rituals of this powerful season. With it's underlying emphasis on repentance and renewal, it fits in so well with our resolutions that we made at the beginning of the new year.

I don't know about you, but my prayer life and my Bible/Devotional study times can sometimes be sporadic at best. I have good intentions, but the time from September through December is so filled with busy activities: Pumpkin Patch, Charge Conference, Thanksgiving, Advent and Christmas fill most of my days and ways of being. I pray throughout the day, I read portions of God's word on the go (there's even a podcast that I get from a Jesuit group based in London entitled "Pray as you go"!)...but my soul wants and needs so much more depth. Lent is the time that is created for just such a need! We are called to stop and listen to the Lord, reflecting on our relationship with Him, renewing a right spirit within.

If you'd like to join me in a 40 day daily Lenten prayer focus, I invite you to engage in this powerful gift that God offers to us. I have a daily guide that will help us in our prayer time through prayer, reflection and journaling. Once a week we will come together with a prayer partner to pray and account to each other how our spiritual life is. If this interests you, call or speak with me and we'll put our groups of 2 or 3 prayer partners together. We'll begin on Ash Wednesday and hopefully, these 40 days will lead to a lifetime of daily prayer, one day at a time!

Whether you decide to pray in a group, with a prayer partner, or not let us all covenant to deepen our prayer life that we honor the God who saved us and gave Himself to us that we might have life and have it abundantly!

Africa University

The Christian Church is growing faster in Africa than in any other continent in the world. For many years The United Methodist Church has

helped Africans to meet Christ through our missionary efforts. Now local leaders are being trained in the Africa University to lead the Church.

Africa University is a place where Africans from across the continent can come together to learn about Christ, to learn about the church, to learn about leadership. A place where they can share with each other successful methods of reaching their own people for Christ.

ETHNIC MINISTRIES

Lydia Patterson Institute in El Paso has historically provided most of the pastors to Spanish speaking congregations in Texas. Ethnic Local Church funds provide direct grants to local churches who are initiating ethnic ministries and to ethnic congregations who need special assistance. Our sister conference, the Rio Grande Conference, receives direct support for its clergy candidates through scholarships.

Most of our members are Anglo, but we live in an area that is increasingly made up of persons whose ethnic background is Hispanic, Black and Asian and we need to reach out to them.

There is one Christ and one table at which we all share bread and wine. Through this apportionment, we work to reach out to our neighbors and bring them to Christ and into our churches.

Fellow animal lovers!

Beginning in January and continuing each month, I will be collecting pet food donations to hand out as part of St. Mark's support of our community. The distributions will take place during the scheduled food truck visits.

Many folks do not realize that beloved pets are sometimes the first family members to be affected by a down-turn in a household's financial situation. These pets are turned into already over-flowing shelters or worse, they are put out on the streets to fend for themselves. By assisting these families with the ability to feed their pets, many of these animals will be kept in their loving homes.



A Journey with Christ

While they were talking and discussing, Jesus himself came near and walked with them. - Luke 24:15

The walk to Emmaus is an experience of Christian spiritual renewal and formation that begins with a threeday short course in Christianity. It is an opportunity to meet Jesus Christ in a new way as God's grace and love is revealed to you through other believers.

The Walk to Emmaus experience begins with the prayerful discernment and invitation from a sponsor. After one accepts this invitation they complete an application. The Emmaus leaders prayerfully consider each applicant and in God's time, the person is invited to attend a three-day experience of New Testament Christianity as a lifestyle.

Following the three-day experience, participants are joined in small groups to support each other in their ongoing walk with Christ.

Through the formational process of accountable discipleship in small groups and participation in the Emmaus community, each participant's individual gifts and servant-leadership skills are developed for use in the local church and its mission. Participants are encouraged to find ways to live out their individual call to discipleship in their home, church, and community.

The objective of Emmaus is to inspire, challenge, and equip the local church members for Christian action in their homes, churches, communities and places of work. Emmaus lifts up a way for our grace-filled lives to be lived and shared with others.

From the Wesley Nurse Red Dress Sunday

Faith, health, and healing have been intertwined since

ancient times. Today the message of health and hope is as powerful and important as ever.

At this time, I am sharing an urgent message about heart health with all the women in our congregation and those who love them. Most women don't know their biggest health threat. Its not breast cancer, or aids, it is heart disease. Yet, most women still think it is a man's disease. A new slogan says it well: "Heart disease doesn't care what you wear-it's the #1 killer of women."

This month, some agencies have asked the women in their agency to wear a red dress as a powerful visual reminder to take care of their hearts. Our wives, mothers, daughters, nieces, and grand-daughters need to learn the truth about heart disease:

- † One out of four American women dies of heart disease.
- † Approximately 6 million American women have coronary disease.
- † Two-thirds of women who have had a heart attack do **not** make a full recovery
- † Heart disease can permanently damage your heart and your life.

But there's good news too. During the month of February, we are supporting a nationwide awareness campaign called "The Heart Truth" sponsored by the federal government and many other national and community organizations.

The *Red Dress* has one main purpose: to remind everyone (women in particular)

that our hearts are not only important to our spiritual life, but to our physical life as well.

To have a healthy heart is critical to know the risk factors for heart disease, they are:

- † High blood pressure
- † High cholesterol
- † Diabetes
- † Smoking
- † Being over weight
- † Being physically inactive
- † Having a family history of early heart disease
- † Age (55 or older for women)

Having just one risk factor increases your chances of having heart disease. Your risk sky rockets with each added factor.

God has given us the job of keeping ourselves healthy. For women, this means taking the time to care for themselves. We all have the power to prevent or control heart disease, and we can do this by taking simple steps:

Don't smoke and if you do quit. Aim for a healthy weight. Get moving (physical activity).

Eat a diet low in saturated fat, trans fat and cholesterol and moderate in total fat. Know your numbers, as your doctor or Wesley Nurse to check your blood pressure, cholesterol, and blood glucose.

Making the changes that lead to heart health is not easy, but with God's help, we can find the courage and strength to take action.




