Project Transformation: What is the status?

As you know the Church Conference voted for the Trustees Committee to negotiate with Project Transformation and when we arrived at an agreement, we would "transfer" the Lovely Lane and the south parking lot to Project Transformation. We thought that we were going to give the building and land to Project Transformation for their ministry. However, due to legal requirements, property lines, etc. they discovered that it would be very expensive and time consuming for us to just give them the land.

They requested that the church lease it to them instead. With a long-term lease they would be able to borrow the funds they need to complete the remodeling. We agreed that this would still fit the intentions of the congregation to allow them to use the building and remodel it as they see fit.

They had an attorney create a proposed lease for us to review and, if necessary, make changes. The Trustees reviewed the proposed lease and made some suggestions. The lease would be for a term of 50 years with the option for them to extend it 3 times for 10 years each time. They would put meters on the utilities so the church would receive a bill from CPS or SAWS and then we would invoice them for the amount that went through their meters each month. They would put \$1500 on deposit with the congregation in the event that something happened to them and Project Transformation ceased to exist, we could use that money to pay for any utilities that might still be owed. They would have the right to remodel the building and use the parking lot as needed. They will have to provide insurance on the building and will not be on the church's insurance.

The Trustees asked some questions regarding sub-leases and environmental clean-up and we are waiting for their response. No firm decisions have been made yet, but their target start date is February and they want to be able to use it for housing this summer. The use of any other facilities like Fellowship Hall, the gym, or the Sanctuary will need to be negotiated under a separate Memorandum of Understanding and will not be a part of the lease. We want their ministry to succeed and hope that we can get the differences worked out soon.

PERUVIAN BISHOP EXHORTS SOLIDARITY WITH VENEZUELAN MIGRANTS.

"As Christians, we are called every day to generously practice hospitality", said Bishop Samuel Aguilar, from the Methodist Church of Peru, as he lamented cases of xenophobia, discrimination and violence suffered by thousands of Venezuelans in different parts of Latin America.

"It's time to show solidarity, to consider as our own the needs of our Venezuelan brothers and sisters", added Aguilar. The bishop's comments were shared to participants of "Qonakuy", the Methodist Church of Peru's biannual roundtable on mission, held in the Peruvian capital last year.

Peru alone has already received more than 750,000 Venezuelans, 80% of which are currently living in Lima. The Methodist Church of Peru itself, a member of the World Council of Churches (WCC), welcomed three families of Venezuelans to live at the "Casa Metodista", the church national headquarters.

The World Council of Churches is an ecumenical partner supported by the Interdenominational Cooperation Fund apportionment, which enables United Methodists to

share a presence and a voice in the activities of several national and worldwide ecumenical organizations.

"Many of our brothers and sisters from Venezuela have arrived here after overcoming so many different challenges and here they face even more problems, such as accommodation, access to food and health care, as well as difficulties in finding employment", said Aguilar.

The national superintendent of migrations reported that more than 11,400 temporary residence permits have been granted to Venezuelan migrants. Between 500 and 800 Venezuelans enter the country daily.

"In any moment, we as church asked if we should welcome them or not," said Aguilar. "We just did. We opened our doors. I believe that God is judging us today based on the way we treat migrants and refugees worldwide".

December receipts were \$666 lower than budgeted. December operating expenses were \$11,735 higher than budgeted. Mission Giving expenses were unfavorable as we made an apportionment payment of \$17,551 in December. This payment completes our Mission Giving commitment for the year. Trustee expenses were favorable due to timing of expenses.

Year-to-Date operating expenses are favorable by \$20,296. Other income in December was \$2,488. In December we recorded a cash outflow of \$14,805. Our operating cash balance on December 31, 2019 was a positive \$5,120.

We continue to spend more each month than we receive in contributions. This will result in our need to use reserve funds to pay our monthly obligations. If you have any suggestion on how we can increase our monthly contributions, please let us know. The Finance Committee thanks you for your support to St. Mark's. God Bless you all.


