Finance Committee Reflections



We hope that everyone is ready for the holidays and the start of a new year. As we sit back and reflect, we wonder where 2012 went!

The November financial results have our contributions being less than 2011 and the budget. Through November, we are nearly \$15,500 lower than last year and nearly \$16,000 behind the budget.

Fortunately, our operating expenses have been lower than last year and the budget as well. This is the result of the vacancy in the Christian Formation position and our failure to be current on apportionment payments. With one month remaining, we need to pay \$14,070 to achieve our apportionment commitment. With amounts in our designated account, interest from our TMF endowment fund and an additional transfer from our TMF Parsonage account to cover the second half of 2012, we find ourselves over \$5000 short.

At the end of November, our operating cash balance is \$6,060.

Your generosity throughout 2012 is so appreciate, not only your monetary contributions, but also the time and talent so many of you donate. Without the support of so many, the financial condition of St. Mark's would be negatively impacted. At this time, please remember that Christmas is about Christ. Please be as generous as possible so we are able to meet our apportionment commitment.

- *83.2 cents stays in your local church for ministries and expenses
- *Less than 4 cents goes to United Methodist churchwide missions, salaries, and administrative costs

*12.8 cents goes for regional ministries in your annual conference and jurisdiction.

To paraphrase John Wesley's words: Do all the good you can, in all the places you can, to all the people you can.

One way to accomplish this task is through apportioned funds, a method of giving that proportionally allocates the general church budgets to conferences (which subsequently apportion to local churches). This method of giving has become a strong, generous tradition and a personal lifelong commitment.

Together, through connected congregations, United Methodists accomplish what no single church, district, or annual conference ever could hope to do. In this way, each individual, each family, each congregation gives a fair share for the church's work.


6. Often when we lose hope and think this is the end, GOD smiles from above and says, "Relax, sweetheart, it's just a bend, not the end!
