JANUARY IS GLAUCOMA AWARENESS MONTH

Glaucoma is a complicated disease in which damage to the optic nerve leads to progressive, irreversible vision loss. Glaucoma is the second leading cause of blindness. There is no specific level of elevated eye pressure that definitely leads to glaucoma; conversely, there is no lower level of IOP that will absolutely eliminate a person's risk of developing glaucoma. JANUARY IS CERVICAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH

Cervical Health Awareness Month is a chance to raise awareness about how women can protect themselves from HPV (human papillomavirus) and cervical cancer. HPV is a very common infection that spreads through sexual activity. It's also a major cause of cervical cancer. About 79 million Americans currently have HPV. Many people with HPV don't know they are infected. The good news? The HPV vaccine (shot) can prevent HPV and cervical cancer can be prevented with regular screening tests (called Pap tests) and follow-up care. Cervical cancer screenings can help detect abnormal (changed) cells early, **before** they turn into cancer. 

November contributions were lower than both 2014 and the budget for the month and year-to-date.

Operating expenses are less than budgeted year-to-date; however, our lower apportionment payments account for a majority of the favorableness.

Our ending operating cash balance was a negative \$5,405. As has been previously brought to your attention, our contributions are not sufficient to cover our expenses. Please be as generous as possible.
