



Comments:

October contributions were \$1,164 less than budgeted and \$2,378 less than November 2016. Other income was \$156 less than budgeted and \$487 higher than 2016.

Operating expenses were \$3,098 higher than budgeted and \$5,826 higher than 2016. Versus the budget Operating expenses were unfavorable primarily due Trustee expenses, which were partially offset by lower Mission Giving and Lay Compensation. Versus 2016, operating expenses are primarily the result of Trustee Expenses.

October had a cash outflow of \$11,116. Our operating cash balance decreased to a negative \$11,998.

As we are in the Christmas season, we ask that you be as generous as possible with regards to St. Mark's. Since our operating cash balance is negative and we still owe nearly \$8,000 for apportionments to achieve our annual commitment, we will need to transfer funds from our TMF operations savings account. Your donations will reduce the amount needed to be transferred.

The Finance Committee asks you to review your level of support to St. Mark's, and ask that you keep St Mark's in your prayers.
