Goal: Take care of those who care for the church. 2.3 cents of every apportioned dollar goes to Pensions.

They gave their lives in ministry to the Rio Texas Conference Churches. Now it's time for the Rio Texas Conference Churches to give back.

This apportionment subsidizes current health benefits for pastors. The pension apportionment pays 50% of the cost of the coverage for each full time pastor appointed to one of our churches, while the remainder of the cost is paid by the church and the pastor.



# From Our Pastor. . .

Sue Horner, Ann and I just got back from Annual Conference, where I was just re-appointed for my 5<sup>th</sup> year at St. Mark's! I am more grateful than I can find words to express for the privilege and honor to be able to serve this con-

gregation for another year as your pastor; I thank God for yet another opportunity to lead our church forward to be the church we are called to be for the cause of Christ. ### **ZIKA VIRUS**

With summer and mosquito season upon us, it is important to be aware of a particular health hazard to pregnant women and newborns, the Zika virus. Below you will find information, statistics and important steps on how to prevent contracting the virus.

#### What is Zika Virus?

Zika virus is primarily spread to people through mosquito bites. The virus can be spread from mother to child. Spread of the virus through blood transfusion and sexual contact has also been reported.

Most people infected with the virus have mild or no symptoms. For those who do develop symptoms, illness is generally mild and typically lasts a few days to a week. The most common symptoms of Zika virus disease are fever, rash, joint pain, and conjunctivitis (red eyes).

Severe disease requiring hospitalization is uncommon and fatalities are rare. An increase in Guillain-Barre syndrome, a condition in which your immune system attacks part of your nervous system, was noted during an outbreak of Zika virus in French Polynesia in 2014. An increase in microcephaly, a condition where a baby's head is much smaller than expected and can cause developmental delays, was noted during an outbreak of Zika virus in Brazil in 2015.


#### **How Can I prevent Zika?**

- Apply EPA-approved insect repellent.
- Wear clothing that covers hands, arms, legs and other exposed skin. This can include pants, long-sleeve shirts, socks and hats with mosquito netting.
- ♦ In warmer weather, wear lightweight, loose-fitting clothing that covers exposed skin.
- Remove standing water in cans, bottles, buckets, tires, wheel barrows or any container that can hold water.
- Cover trash cans or containers where water can collect.

Texas has had **42** reported cases of Zika virus disease. Of those, **41** were in travelers who were infected abroad and diagnosed after they returned home; one of those travelers was a pregnant woman. One case involved a Dallas County resident who had sexual contact with someone who acquired the Zika infection while traveling abroad.

**Texas Zika Cases by County:** Bexar=6, Dallas=6, Denton=2, Ellis=1, Fort Bend=2, Grayson=1, Harris=13, Tarrant=4, Travis=2, Val Verde=1, Williamson=1, Wise=1. **Total Zika Cases=42**. ### Comments:

May contributions were \$765 less than budgeted and \$1,112 lower than 2015. Rental income was higher than budgeted by \$2,858.

Operating expenses were \$6,670 less than budgeted. For the month, all expense categories were lower than budgeted. Compared to May 2015, operating expenses are lower by \$17,272. Mission Giving was \$6,592 lower than last year. Pastor compensation was lower by \$6,167 (no associate pastor this year) and Lay compensation was lower by \$3,927 (no bookkeeper or youth coordinator this year).

We continue to have a positive operating cash balance. This is possible as a result of lower expense for the month.

Through May, our apportionment payments are \$2,599 lower than budgeted.

We are thanking each of you for your financial support to St. Mark's. We are hopeful the "Memorial/In Honor Of" brick program will be successful and help our cash balance. God Bless!
