# Finance Committee Reflections: Sounds From the Bean Counters

We hope you all had a very Happy Easter! Please pray for rain as we definitely need a good soaking to keep everything green as long as possible before we change to the late summer brown.

April contributions were strong. We had nearly \$29,000 in contributions of which \$7,200 related to our Easter offering. A tremendous show of your financial support at a time we needed it. However, not of any great surprise, as you always come through when needed. Our year-to-date contributions are now \$1,000 ahead of budget and over \$500 greater than last year.

Our operating expenses for April were very favorable to last year and the budget. Mission Giving was \$7,600 lower than last year (in 2013 the first significant payments were made using the Easter offering which was designated to apportionments). Compared to the budget, Mission Giving was lower by almost \$2,100, as we did not make an additional payment during the month. Trustee spending was favorable in April. We were \$2,700 lower than budgeted and \$3,300 less than last year. This favorable spending was the result of lower custodial supply expense and lower repairs and maintenance. Year-to-date

our operating expenses are lower than budgeted but are higher than 2013 due to higher repair and maintenance, lay personnel compensation and Mission Giving.

For the month, we had a cash inflow of almost \$10,000. This results in a year-to-date cash outflow of only \$100.

Through four months, our apportionment payments are nearly \$14,000, which exceeds budget by \$2,800. As a result of the strong Easter offering which significantly improved our operating cash position, we will be sending \$3,700 in May.

Our operating cash balance entering April was a negative \$2,775. At April 30, our operating cash balance is \$6,934. What a turnaround!

We continually are amazed at your generosity. It's not just your donations of treasures, but also the time and talent that so many contribute. There are always members working on projects which if we hired out the work would result in cash outflow. The St. Mark's community is truly blessed.

Texas Conference of Churches - Helps churches and Christians of all denominations work together for common goals.

There is one Christ...and one table, at which we all share bread and wine. This apportionment allows us to reach out to our neighbors and bring them to Christ and into our churches.



Last night at our Administrative Board meeting, we took a new step in faith that will surely deepen and enhance the mission and ministry of St. Mark's. We are partnering with Nuevo Amancer United Methodist Church, a missional church on the site of the old Browning UMC next to Kelly Air Force Base. Nuevo Amancer ("New Dawn") UMC is being led by Octaviano Garcia; a man whom I have been mentoring for ordained ministry. He is a very evangelistic and powerful man of God, who is leading his church into a new day. However, the church is still a mission church and is unable to stand completely alone. As such, they do not have their own bank account and employee identification number, which is necessary to be a tax-free entity. Aldersgate UMC, for the past few years has offered them assistance and helped them with an account under Aldersgate's account; unfortunately, Aldersgate can no longer offer them this assistance. This is where we come in!

Nuevo Amanacer will become a mission of St. Mark's; their members will transfer onto our church rolls. We will receive their bills and make payments for them. Of course, we will receive their offerings as well. For the life of Nuevo Amancer, they have stood alone financially; they pay their pastor's salary and all their bills...they just didn't have an account with a Federal ID number. Our Financial Officers assure us that this is easily done; no risk to us but will provide much needed assistance to a sister church and help enhance the kingdom of God. Other churches have done similar discipling; Chapel Hill UMC (Kent Kinard's church) did this with Windsong UMC until Windsong became large enough and strong enough to stand alone. Alamo Heights UMC is also working with Asbury UMC in much the same way.

So, overnight St Mark's has grown by some 30-40 members and is reaching out into the community for Christ in a powerful way! Nuevo Amanacer will enrich our own ministries and we can enrich theirs. I look forward to our churches working together for Christ and I give thanks to the Lord for opportunities to be missional and meaningful. God bless our ministries and may they bring God all the glory and honor that He deserves! Dios le bendiga! ("God bless you")

# **Wesley Nurse News**

The focus for the month of June is on high blood pressure. The blood pressure is typically recorded as two numbers, written as a ratio like this:

**Systolic** – the top number, which is also the higher of the two numbers, measures the pressure in the arteries when the heart beats (when the heart muscle contracts).

**Diastolic** – the bottom number, which is also the lower of the two numbers, measures the pressure in the arteries between heartbeats (when the heart muscle is resting between beats and refilling with blood).

If the measurement reads 120 systolic and 80 diastolic, you would say "120 over 80" or write "120/80".

#### American Heart Association Recommendation for healthy blood pressure:

Normal Blood Pressure: Systolic BP <120 AND Diastolic BP <80

Pre-Hypertension: Systolic BP= 120-139 **OR** Diastolic BP= 80-89

Stage 1 Hypertension: Systolic BP= 140-159 OR Diastolic BP= 90-99

Stage 2 Hypertension: Systolic BP= 160 or higher OR Diastolic BP= 100 or higher

Hypertensive Crisis: Systolic BP >180 OR Diastolic BP >110

(Emergency Care needed)

The **Joint National Committee (JNC 8)** recently released new blood pressure guidelines. JNC 8 concluded the blood pressure for people over 60 years old should be less than 150/90 and people under 60 years old should remain less than 140/90.

ALWAYS ask your doctor what should your specific blood pressure range should be. Depending on your age and health history, your doctor may recommend different ranges.

If you are interested, Mission u will be participating in a mission action project making birthing kits for UMCOR (the United Methodist Committee on Relief). Kits or monetary donations will be accepted.

#### 2014: UMCOR Birthing Kits

- 1 small bar soap, original packaging (motel, hotel sizes acceptable)
- 1 pair latex, surgical or thin rubber gloves\* (no kitchen or thick rubber gloves)
- 1 Square Yard of clear plastic sheeting, 4 mil thick\*, must be 4 mil
- 1 single edge razor blade\*, covered in paper or cardboard for safety; (no shaving razors)
- 2 cotton flannel receiving blankets (30"x30" or 32"x32"), cotton flannel, please; no thermal or fleece or other fabrics.
- 3 piece of cotton string (12" long)\*\*, must be clean, bundle and tie together, no yarn
- 1 plastic bag one gallon, sealable

\*These items are available in paint departments \*\*Number 3 crochet thread is a good thickness

Fold plastic sheeting and blankets so they will fit into the bag. Lay all loose items on top of the blankets and sheeting. Slide all items into the plastic bag. Squeeze as much air out as possible.


