Finance Committee Reflections: Sounds From the Bean Counters

We hope everyone is doing well and surviving our South Texas winter. It seems to be colder and nastier than normal and we sure do need some rain.

Contributions in January were lower than both the budget and last year. We are behind last year by \$3,200 and trail the budget by \$2,800. We are hopeful that contributions will rebound. As you all remember, budgeted contributions only allow us to break even and leaves us no surplus.

January operating expenses were \$10,700 higher than 2013 and \$3,700 higher than budgeted. Versus last year, the most significant areas of increase were Mission Giving, up \$6,500, Lay Personnel Compensation, up \$2,400 primarily the result of five pay periods, and Trustee Expense, up \$1,400. Versus the budget, Mission Giving was up \$5,100, offset by lower Trustee spending of \$1,600.

As was just mentioned, Mission Giving was higher than both 2013 and the budget. This was the result of our paying \$7,900 in January. This puts us \$5,100 ahead of budget.

At the end of December our operating cash balance was \$7,054. At the end of January this balance had fallen to \$2,995. This is primarily the result of our lower January contributions.

Thank you all for your continued financial support, and remember to always keep the church's finances in your thoughts and pravers.

World Service Fund Benevolences

The World Service Benevolence Fund is the primary mission and ministry funding of the connectional church. These funds go to the General Church to pay for national and worldwide mission and supports the Agencies of the General Church whose work is devoted to accomplishing the Bishop's 4 areas of ministry focus.

Poverty: one goal - train and place 50 native leaders with strategic mission partners in poor areas to respond to critical issues of importance to women and children.

Global Health: one goal - work with international partners to reduce by 66 percent malaria related deaths of children under the age of 5.

New and Existing Congregations: one goal - Recruit 1,000 new church planters to start 650 new churches in the US, targeting 50% of those to be racial and ethnic congregations.

Develop Christian Leadership: one goal - Increase by 2.5% the number of candidates for ordained ministry who are under age 35.

Through the World Service Benevolence Fund, we are all doing it together.




Mid-Winter Camp at Mt Wesley

The Holy Spirit is moving mightily through the life of St Mark's UMC; new growth, new life, new beginnings! Aren't you grateful to be a part of God's plan for new life and transformation for the sake of Jesus Christ and his gospel? I know that I am; and I'm grateful to be in ministry with such a remarkable and serving congregation. May God continue to bless us and may we bless the world that He loves so much!





Lent begins Wednesday, March 5th with our Ash Wednesday services at 12:00 and 7:00 PM.


During the period of Lent, we will have a time of fellowship with a light meal in the Fellowship Hall, followed by a devotional beginning at 6:30 PM.


