World Service: Allowing the Connection The World Service Fund is the backbone of the Agencies of the General Church, whose aim is to flourish in the four ministry goals of the Council of Bishops:

Poverty - Fifty native leaders will be trained and placed with strategic mission partners in poor areas, with special emphasis placed on responding to the critical needs of women and children.

Global Health - Reduce by 66% the number of malaria-related deaths of children under the age of 5 by working with international partners.

New and Existing Congregations - Recruit 1000 new church planters to "seed" 650 new churches in the US, specifically targeting 50% of those to be racial and ethnic congregations.

Develop Christian Leadership - The church must recruit young people for ministry and provide them with the skills necessary to be effective in this new time of opportunity. That includes women and people of color the world over. Similarly, we must offer leadership training for lay people who are in ministry in countless ways.

21 CENTS of every apportioned dollar is allotted for General and Jurisdictional

Africa University supports a Christian University in Africa where Christian leaders are trained. Africans from across the continent come together at Africa University to learn about Christ, and to learn about church leadership. It's also a place where they can share their successful methods of reaching their own people for Christ.

The Ministerial Education Fund provides financial support for the recruitment of and ongoing education of clergy at the general level and at the local annual conference including scholarships.

The Lydia Patterson Institute located in El Paso has historically provided most of the pastors to Spanish-speaking congregations in Texas.

Our sister conference - the Rio Grande conference - receives direct support for its clergy candidates through scholarships.

Happy and Blessed Lent to us all! As we enter this season of reflection and repentance, we also look for signs of change that reflect our sincere desire to grow in the life that Christ is calling us into. We are seeing some of those signs at St. Mark's already! First, we welcome Helen Brock, who is a pastor from the Rio Grande Conference, who will be working with us at St. Mark's for a few months, as she awaits an appointment with our newly formed Rio Texas Annual Conference! Helen will be working part-time, 20 hours a week, and will be using the front room, where our Food Pantry is kept, as an office. She is bilingual and will be helping with ongoing ministry tasks at the Church, with a whole range of opportunities: help with the Food Truck and vouchers, pastoral care with our neighbors from the community and our church, assisting as a liturgist in worship, preaching on occasion, helping in our Sunday Schools and generally just being the woman of God that she is! We welcome her to St. Mark's and look forward to working with her to advance the cause of Christ.

Another sign of growth and renewal that is beginning to bear fruit is our conversations that we are having with a person for the position of Child/Youth Minister. We are meeting as the SPPRC and developing a job description and salary to hire someone to work part-time in this area with the children and youth of our neighborhood and their families. Naturally, Kim Durick and Susan Philbin will continue, thankfully, to develop and enhance their own established ministries with the youth of our church. Our new Children's/Youth Minister will help us to engage in a broader and more deliberate and sustained outreach to the families in our neighborhood; specifically the ones from Arnold Elementary and the ones who attend VBS, Easter Egg Hunt, Pumpkin Patch and the like. The Metro Mission Board of the Las Misiones District has given us a grant of \$3,000 to "kickstart" this ministry, so we are indeed blessed. We pray that God will send a faithful servant to help us as we seek to bring the children, youth and their families to Christ and to St. Mark's UMC!

Be in prayer as we engage in these new opportunities for service and ministry. Let us rise to the challenge that the Holy Spirit sends to God's people to break out of conventional and established ways of life and go forth with conviction and courage to fulfill the mandates of the Great Commission to go out into all the world, baptizing and making disciples for Christ. COLORECTAL CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

Colorectal Cancer is a cancer that starts in the colon or rectum. It is the fourth most common cancer in the United States and the second leading cause of death of all the cancers. Most colorectal cancers develop over a period of years. Before a cancer develops, usually a polyp will form in the inner lining of the colon or rectum. A polyp is a non-cancerous tissue that can eventually develop into cancer. That is why it is so important for people over the age of 50 to have a colorectal screening, which includes having a colonoscopy. Polyps can be detected and removed during the colonoscopy procedure, therefore eliminating the likelihood of developing cancer. Some people may need to get screened earlier, depending on their family history. If people 50 years and older get screened routinely, 6 out of 10 deaths from colorectal cancer could be prevented. Finance Committee Reflections: Sounds From the Bean Counters

We are already well into 2015. Time just keeps the weather news from

Boston, it only reaffirms why I live in South Texas, and I suspect the same goes for you all as well.

January contributions were \$18,500 which was \$1,300 higher than last year and \$700 higher than budgeted.

January operating expenses were \$7,150 less than last year and \$4,500 less than budgeted. Mission Giving is the biggest reason for the favorable spending. Last January, we paid almost \$8,000 towards our apportionments. This year we only paid \$500. Versus the budget, Trustee spending was also favorable by \$1,500.

While our January contributions were favorable and our expenditures were lower than budgeted, it doesn't mean that our financial condition is strong. As you remember, we budgeted a large amount of


other income. In January, this amount was \$5,900. We were unable to achieve this marching on. After watching amount and fell short by \$4,200. This resulted in our having a cash outflow of \$1,100 for the month.

> Our apportionment payments to date trail the budget by \$2,700. In February, we will pay \$3,800 which will help, but we will still trail the budget after two months.

Our operating cash balance at the end of the year was a negative \$6,795. At the end of January, this improved to a negative \$1,670. Since we had a cash outflow for the month, this improvement was not the result of operations, but occurs since we transferred cash from our TMF account to offset Pastor's housing allowance and we received interest income earned on several TMF accounts.

We ask that you keep the financial condition of St. Mark's in your prayers. Our thoughts and prayers will be with each and every one of you. God Bless.

Loving Service Wouldn't you like to help?

Many years ago, St. Mark's organized Loving Service Groups to furnish and serve receptions for the families of our members when a death occurs. We feel this is a vital part of our ministry when families and friends gather to share the life of their loved one, sharing stories and sometimes seeing folks whom they have not seen for a very long time. We celebrate the life that was lived on their journey toward eternity. This service is provided at no charge to the family, though some do make a voluntary contribution. When this happens the money is kept in a fund toward preparation for the next service.

Sue Horner and myself are currently co-chairs and we purchase, prepare and serve the reception (with the help of folks like Kathy, Dorothy and Joanne) asking different groups to help cover the cost. The groups are rotated and generally each group is asked to assist only once every 12-16 months. We cannot predict death so the schedule is not regular, operating on a "needs" basis.

The groups are made up of volunteers and currently our lists are very low due to the death or moving of many persons. I am appealing to any or each of you who would like to serve in this capacity - it will cost you about \$20.00 usually every year and a half. We currently have 7 groups, but the number of persons in several of our groups are very low and need to be replaced by "you"!!

If you would be willing to serve our Lord and your church in this capacity, please see or call me and I will add you to one of our groups. The time of transition from this life to the next will come to each of us and our church takes joy when we can assist each other in saying our "Good-byes" until we meet again.

I'll be expecting to hear from many of you. If you are already in one of our groups, you do not need to call me.
