# A Theology Of United Methodist Giving Apportionments

The role of steward is a central one throughout the Bible. The Scriptures illustrate deep biblical foundations. In Exodus 16, the story of the manna in the wilderness is a foundational story for understanding the way in which God provides for the needs of the community of the people of God and its journey through the world. It defines the important qualities that distinguish God's people as a community of stewards.

The first of those qualities is discernment. The name "manna" itself comes from the Hebrew words for the response made by Israel. "What is it, manna?" Like Israel, we stand surrounded by resources and often fail to recognize them for what they really are. Namely, God's gifts to provide for human need and to empower a community to serve those needs. The manna story urges us to the discernment that sees all of our resources as the gift of God, for the needs of God's world and not as our own individual or local possessions.

A second quality out of the manna story is equity. The distribution of the manna was related to need. No one was to have too much or too little. Now, of course, this was a divine miracle at the time; but the church -- the community of faith -- has read this Scripture as a mandate. We must exercise stewardship over the gifts of God's resources in ways that make resources accessible to those who have the greatest need. Resources are not to be hoarded. The abundant life is not the life marked by excess, but by enough, and enough for all.


And finally, a third quality from this story is the quality of mission. We receive God's gifts as God's stewards to enable our participation in God's mission, and not as the result of the success of our own strategic plans or material security. As in the manna story, this requires ongoing commitment and engagement in receiving and using God's gifts. We cannot hoard those gifts for a future day. We cannot measure their use by our needs alone. The mission requires distribution and use of God's gifts for the sake of the mission in a consistent commitment to receiving and giving God's gifts.

Discernment, equity and mission are the constant marks of the people of God as the community of stewards.

All of these qualities are inspiringly reflected in Paul's letter to the church at Corinth, when he wrote to ask for a collection to aid the church in Jerusalem. In 2 Corinthians 8:13-14a (NRSV), Paul writes, "I do not mean that there should be relief for others and pressure on you, but it is a question of a fair balance between your present abundance and their need, so that their abundance may be for your need."

As it is written, the one who gathered much had nothing over, and the one who gathered little had no shortage. Take to heart Jesus' admonition, "To those to whom much is given, much will be required."

## From Our Pastor ...

This Wednesday, March 1st, is the day that we refer to as Ash Wednesday, a day that ushers in a new season of the gospel year, Lent. Lent is the 40 days (excluding Sundays) that occur before Easter Sunday and is traditionally a

time of repentance and self-examination and reflection, leading to a deeper spiritual life of faith and discipleship. As a child, the church that I grew up in didn't observe Ash Wednesday or the season of Lent; we didn't observe Maundy Thursday or Good Friday, Easter was the big celebration. The Bible never actually refers to Ash Wednesday or Lent, but the practice of imposing ashes as a sign of repentance and mourning is found in various passages, such as 2 Samuel 13:19, Esther 4:1, Job 2:8 and others.

Lately, with retirement very much on my mind and, with it, an awareness of my own mortality, I find that Ash Wednesday is a very profound and meaningful practice that helps me to put my faith journey and life in perspective. We will be celebrating the Imposition of Ashes at a noon service on Wednesday, March 1st in the sanctuary. This service is very much a time of personal reflection and participation and I am grateful that our church will be able to offer this unique experience to all. We will also offer the service again on Wednesday evening at 7 pm. I will also be available for "ashes on the go" throughout the afternoon for those who seek to receive this sign of faith but are constrained by time demands to participate in a more reflective experience. For the last four years, I have been able to serve people who were waiting at the bus stop or who were simply passing by and who would otherwise be unable to pause during their day to invoke the meaning of this season of the gospel year.

Again, while I find this service very profound, it doesn't necessarily speak to everyone. If you have never participated in this ritual, why not inquire of the Lord and ask if this might not be an experience that can help you on your journey of faith? We are all different, unique and diverse, coming from different backgrounds and faith positions. The one thing that unites us all is God's universal and unending love for us. I hope that we can all be touched more deeply by that love as we journey through Lent and life together.

We can use this month to raise awareness about colorectal cancer and take action toward prevention. Communities, organizations, families, and individuals can get involved and spread the word.


Here are just a few ideas:



### Comments:

January contributions were \$134 lower than budgeted and \$1,361 lower than January 2016. Other income was \$1,030 more than budgeted and \$1,642 more than 2016. January contributions included five Sunday and \$975 in Christmas Contributions. Other Income was higher due to receiving \$2,594 interest income from TMF.

Operating expenses were \$5,586 favorable to the budget while \$310 more than 2016. All expense categories were favorable to budget for the month with the exception of Pastor compensation.

January had a cash inflow of \$4,054. Our monthly contributions in January were stronger than budgeted. Our operating cash balance increased to a positive \$4,306.

The Finance Committee thanks your for your support during 2016 and looks forwards to strong contributions in 2017. God bless!
