say so myself, it is tasty! Other than stirring the pot periodically till tonight, as I perform my duty vigilantly, I find that my own thoughts are being stirred!

Pastor Maria Soto is on her way to St. Mark's by way of El Buen Samaritano in Harlingen. I am so excited by her appointment! I don't know much about her, but I know that she comes highly recommended by her own District Superintendent in the Valley and she surely will be familiar with the needs and ministries and missions that our community are experiencing. I have no doubt that she is exactly what we need to move our congregation deeper into discipleship for the cause of Christ! One reason that I believe this is because we have been praying for God's help and assistance in discerning His will and our call. When we ask of the Lord, He is faithful and just and will answer. Another reason that I believe this is because I know that our Bishop and his cabinet of District Superintendents want for St. Mark's to thrive and become all that we are capable of being as a community church. They know the potential we have to make a difference in our neighborhood and in our world and they want to send us the best person available to help us grow and develop. And one other reason that I believe that Pastor Maria is the right one is because God is in the business of always doing a new thing! Isaiah 43:19..."See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs forth; do you not perceive it?" For the first time in the history of St. Mark's, the Sr. Pastor will be a Hispanic, bilingual, bicultural woman. What a prophetic witness this congregation will make to the homes of our neighborhood! Her very presence will send a message to the community that we are serious about engaging in outreach and relationship! I am truly delighted in this appointment and I thank God for such discernment.

I sent Pastor Maria a brief note of welcome this past week, assuring her that I am praying for her transition (and my own) as the days move forward. I know that she would love to hear from you as well, offering encouragement and welcome. 

There are brochures in the office and in the Foyer - Please feel free to take as many as you'd like. Here's an abbreviated agenda for the trip:

December 4, 2018: Depart the USA

December 5: Arrive and Transfer to Bethlehem. Have dinner and spend the night in your Bethlehem hotel.

December 6: Visit the Herodion, the fortified palace and final resting place of Herod the Great. In Bethlehem, gaze out over Shepherds' Field and visit the church of the Nativity.

December 7: Visit Kasr el Yehud, the traditional site of the baptism of Jesus. Stop in Jericho, the oldest known inhabited city in the world. Visit Qumran, site of the Dead Sea Scroll discovery. Make a stop at the Shores of the Dead Sea for a quick dip in the salt and mineral-laden waters. Spend the night in Bethlehem.

December 8: Jesus' Ministry in Galilee - Explore the Church of the Fish and the Loaves at Tabgha, traditional site of the feeding of the 5,000. Visit the Mount of Beatitudes, Capernaum, and visit the synagogue built on the site where Jesus taught. Cross the Sea of Galilee on a special boat ride, complete with an onboard worship service. Spend the night in Jerusalem.

December 9: Visit Mt. Zion and stand in the Upper Room. Walk through the ancient rooms of Caiaphas the High Priests' house beneath the Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu. Visit the Temple Mount and pray at the Western Wall. Sit on the Teaching Steps where Jesus Taught.

December 10: Stand atop the Mount of Olives as Jesus did and enjoy a remarkable view of the "Golden City" of Jerusalem. Pray in the Garden of Gethsemane. View the Pool of Bethesda. Sing in the Church of St. Anne (known for its amazing acoustics). Visit Herod's Antonia Fortress, Walk the Via Dolorosa and stand in reverence at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. Visit the Garden Tomb.

December 11: Return Home with a new understanding of the Bible, the land and the life of Jesus!

Comments:

March contributions were \$67 higher than budgeted and \$3,269 lower than March

2016. Other income was \$952 lower than budgeted and \$1,564 less than 2016.

Operating expenses were \$6,495 favorable to the budget and \$6,546 favorable to 2016. Expenses were favorable primarily due to lower Trustee Expenses (lower Electricity and

Insurance timing), Mission Giving as we did not make a payment in March, and Lay Personnel Compensation (no Choir Director Salary).

March had a cash outflow of \$4,993. Our operating cash balance decreased to a negative \$4,127.

The Finance Committee thanks your continued support during 2017. Please keep the Finance Committee in your prayers as decisions inpacting the finances of the church are made.
