Finance Committee Reflections: Sounds From the Bean Counters



Children have returned to school, and with your help, many have the supplies and uniforms they need. Back-to-school also marks the end of the summer vacation season. We hope this is the case at St. Mark's so that we see an increase in attendance and the corresponding contributions. Contributions have been lower through the summer months and an increase would be greatly received.

Contributions in August were \$20,551, which was higher than both 2013 and the budget. The primary reason for the higher contributions is due to having five Sundays in August. Year-to-date, our contributions are lower than 2013 and the budget by \$4,600 and \$4,800 respective-ly.

Operating expenses in August were \$400 higher than last year while \$2,700 less than budget. Versus the budget, the lower spending related to Mission Giving, Trustee expense and Council on Ministries. Compared to August 2013, lower Council on Ministries expense was more than offset by higher Mission Giving, Lay Personnel Compensation and Administrative expenses. Lay Personnel compensation was higher as the result of five paydays in the month. Year-to-date operating expenses are \$2,400 higher than 2013 primarily due to higher Lay Personnel Compensation and Administrative expense partially offset by lower Trustee expense and Council on Ministries spending. Versus the budget, spending is favorable by \$10,400, almost entirely the result of favorable Trustee spending. Way to go Trustees!

The Administration Fund's goal is to support General Conference, Annual Conference Session, The Treasurer's Office, Audits for District and Campus Ministries.


8.2 cents of every apportioned dollar goes to the Administration Fund.

INFLUENZA – WHAT IS IT?

Influenza is a contagious respiratory illness caused by flu viruses that infect the nose, throat, and lungs. It can cause mild to severe illness. Serious outcomes of flu infection can

lead to hospitalization or death. Some people, such as older people, young children, and people with certain chronic health conditions- Diabetes, Asthma, COPD, Heart Failure - are at high risk for serious flu complications. (CDC)

HOW FLU SPREADS and INFECTIOUS PERIOD

- O By droplets made when people with flu cough, sneeze or talk. These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby.
- O By touching a surface or object that has flu virus on it and then touching his or her own mouth, eyes or nose.
- Contagious period may begin one day before symptoms develop and up to 5 to 7 days after becoming sick.
- People may be able to transmit the flu to others before they know they are even sick.

FLU PREVENTION

- **Or Contract Set Set Contract S**
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- Stay home when you are sick -you will help others from catching your illness
- Over your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing -If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your upper sleeve or elbow, not your hands
- Wash your hands –if soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand rub
- Avoid touching your eyes nose or mouth -Germs are often spread when a person touches something that is contaminated with germs and then touches his or her eyes, nose, or mouth.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces at home, work or school, especially when someone is sick.

Ramona Bissett has agreed to be a substitute for Bill if needed. Thanks to Ramona for counting the pumpkins the past several years.

Be sure and bring your gloves and a wheelbarrow if you can. The wheelbarrows really speed up the unloading process. The Boy Scouts will be assisting and we are hoping that the Texas Tiger basketball guys and young people from Roy Maas Youth Alternative will be available to assist with the unloading. Of course, the big treat will be the goodies prepared by Sue Horn-

er and her assistants. We all look forward to the treats she prepares. So, if you can't move pumpkins, come on down and watch and enjoy the goodies.

Anyone interested in helping wash small pumpkins and stuff the treat bags for Story Time should come to Lovely Lane at 9:30 a.m. on October 6th and 7th. We are anticipating between 450 and 500 children joining us for Story Time. That means 500 little pumpkins will have to be washed.

cooked, served, and cleaned up inside. That's "Chef" Dario Leija in the picture below right, trying out a PET with son, Little Dario.






