#### PET to Benefit from September 21 BBQ

St. Mark's will host another BBQ fundraiser on September 21, with PET San Antonio benefitting. PET, or Personal Energy Transportation, is a ministry whose goal is to bring "The Gift of Mobility" to disabled people in developing countries. PET San Antonio is one of 22 building sites in the US, with 4 more in other countries, where three-wheeled, hand-cranked, off-road wheelchairs are produced. These rugged

wheelchairs hold up and get around in rural locations on unpaved terrain where conventional hospital wheelchairs have failed. PETs are designed for people who have lost the use of their legs due to birth defects, diabetes, spinal cord injuries, polio, land mines, and war. They allow the user to leave the confines of his house and village and socialize, go to school and church, and even work. Thus far, over 27,000 PETs have been deliv-



ered to 90 countries. PET is a faith-based, 501(c)(3), tax-deductible, all-volunteer organization. The cost of building a PET wheelchair and shipping it to any country is \$250. Your support of the September 21 BBQ fundraiser will help restore dignity and hope to the lives of disabled people in other countries.

# Finance Committee Reflections: Sounds From the



We hope everyone is enjoying the summer. It has not been difficult to plan an outdoor activity since we don't seem to get any rain any more. But we certainly do need a good soaking to get the aquifer to a better level.

Contributions in July were \$16,559, lower than both 2012 and the budget by approximately \$4,000. Year to date contributions are \$414 higher than last year and trail the budget by \$835.

Operating expenses in July were lower than 2012 by \$1,245, while higher than the budget by \$703. Mission Giving and Pastor Compensation were both higher than July 2012, but more than offset by the lower Trustee and Council on Ministries spending. Compared to the budget, higher Mission Giving was mostly offset by favorable Trustee and Lay Personnel Compensation. Operating expenses year-to-date versus 2012 are higher by \$1,452. Compared to the budget, 2013 spending is lower by approximately \$15,000. Most areas are favorable to the budget.

For the month of July, we had a cash outflow of \$8,096. This was the result of our lower contributions in July. Our summer months tend to have lower contributions, but this July was significantly lower. We hope for stronger months going forward. Year-to-date, our cash outflow is \$2,390.

In July, we paid \$6,152 towards our apportionments (Mission Giving). As a result of the payment, we currently trail the budget by only \$3,230. We hope to be able to continue to make higher monthly payments.

Our operating cash balance at the end of June was \$9,277. At the end of July, we have \$5,397 in operating cash. While our cash outflow was higher, we made a transfer from TMF which helped maintain our cash balance.

As always, we thank you for your continued support. We ask for your prayers regarding the financial help of St. Mark's. Also, please pray for rain.



I hope that everyone has enjoyed our summertime but I'm sure that we are all looking forward to cooler temperatures and, please God, some blessed rain now that September is on the way. As I've written before, God has certainly been raining down His blessings upon us at St. Mark's! We're going to enjoy a wonderful and exciting 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration on Sept 8<sup>th</sup>; it's going to be a real wow-ser, so don't you dare miss it. Also, we have had an incredibly successful summer youth program with Kim Molina Durick and Susan Philbin's help; every Wednesday evening since VBS, they have hosted the children and youth of our church and community for a time of food, fellowship and fun as we offer Christian growth in the Lord. They have done this in conjunction with our Wednesday Evening Praise service, with the result that Wednesday evenings have been very special and solid ministries. We have a wide range of diversity with those who have been attending; all ages and stages of faith development come together to praise God in a casual and committed worship service.
