

Further, he urged them to live on as little as possible, setting by the example of his own living a standard of frugality and simple living that was as countercultural I his day as in our own. Finally, Wesley was adamant that everything saved by this practice should be given to address the needs of the poor. Wesley's followers were to engage in regular ministry with the poor and to give as generously as possible to them.

It was at the class meeting level that Wesley sought to address the financial needs of the growing organization of Methodists. Wesley recognized that classes, rather than individuals, could together be responsible for an additional assessment for projects such as the building of new preaching houses, support for the traveling preachers and other collective needs. By sharing this responsibility as a class, the varying levels of contributions by individual members could be pooled and contributed, allowing more affluent members to assist those of more limited means.

Since earliest days, Methodist giving has been both local and connectional. Mission at the local level was assumed, not optional. It was personal, relational and face-to-face. Additionally, connectional giving was understood as a corporate responsibility, a method of institutional support, which allowed every member of whatever level of financial means to participate through the class meeting. This giving, too, was assumed, as a means of undergirding organizational needs in ministry, church expansion, and later in the establishment of pension support for "worn-out preachers" and widows.

Three Simple Rules

In *Three Simple Rules*, Bishop Rueben P. Job writes of three ways to change the world. Although the rules are ancient, they are timely for today's world. According to Job, "The Wesleyan movement is a prime example of this new creation that is formed when these...rules are adopted as a way of living." These rules tie directly to today's goals of apportionment giving.

- 1. "Do no harm": We can live a life that God wants for us by helping others. Apportionments, taken together, enable us to help more people in more ways. As Bishop Job says, "It is possible to practice a way of living that is in harmony with the life of Jesus and survive, even thrive, in a world like ours. It is both a challenging and rewarding way to live; and each of us, with God's help, can live such a life fully, faithfully and joyfully."
- 2. "Do good": We can live a life that God wants for us by helping others, even those we will never meet, those we consider to have nothing in common with, or who might differ from us economically or culturally. "The words of Jesus and of Wesley suggest that doing good is a universal command. That is, doing good is not limited to those like me or those who like me." Doing good is directed at everyone.
- 3. "Say in love with God": Seeing our apportionments help others not only gives us personal satisfaction; it also demonstrates concretely that we are in love with God. "Staying in love with God was the primary issue of a faithful life then, and it is today. For from such a life of love for God will flow the goodness and love of God to the world. It can be no other way."



Comments:

July contributions were \$3,089 less than budgeted and \$3,146 less than July 2016. Other income was \$900 less than budgeted and \$62 higher than 2016.

Operating expenses were \$5,418 favorable to the budget and \$6,424 favorable to 2016. Expenses were favorable primarily due to lower Trustee Expenses (repairs and maintenance), Lay Personnel compensation, Pastor Compensation, and Mission Giving.

July had a cash outflow of \$1,611. Our operating cash balance improved to a negative \$4,984 as a result of transferring \$4,500 from the Parsonage Account at TMF to help offset the Pastor's housing allowance.

The Finance Committee thanks your continued support during 2017. Please keep the Committee in your prayers as decisions impacting the finances of the church are made.


